Impact Through Teaching!

The international symposium Impact Through Teaching! aims to illuminate the transformative effects and driving forces of emerging educational practices, and to foster a dialogue among international researchers and educators in the field of architecture.

Amidst our growing awareness of changing environmental conditions, the (Post-)Anthropocene provides a context for radical, speculative, hitherto unfamiliar, ethical, ecological and experimental architectural practices. But what are the implications for architecture itself, how does architecture need to be recontextualized to cope with the uncertainties of the climate crisis? It seems time to renegotiate past forces of architectural education and to develop an appropriate vocabulary to capture and document its effects. In doing so, we aim to shed light on the multifaceted dimensions of the outcomes of teaching practices and provide insights that can guide future educational approaches. The symposium provides a collaborative format for exploring the documentation and mediation of pedagogical effects. Across five workshops focusing on Pedagogical Positions, Activist Interventions, Design Practices, Material Practices and Digital Matters, we seek to foster dialogue and networking among emerging teaching methodologies.
